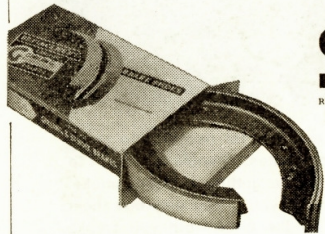
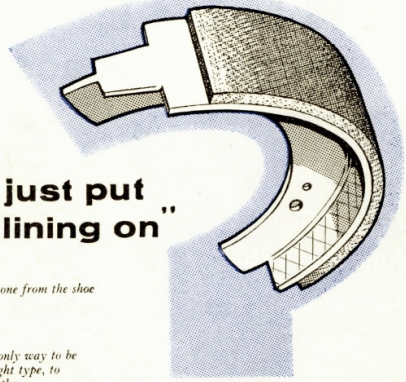

FEW of us will forget our kindly reception in Copenhagen and the wonderful hospitality accorded to us, particularly by the officials of Boldklub. It was most interesting to get a first-hand view of the activities of this Danish Club, which provides for amateur performers only, but apart from football their club caters for tennis and, very surprisingly, cricket. Football matches are played on the municipal stadium in Copenhagen, but Boldklub itself possesses most excellent facilities for all who pursue the three sports we have mentioned, and adjacent to the outdoor pitches and courts they have

wonderful club rooms, bars, offices, committee rooms and banqueting rooms. Additionally some of us observed tennis being played on one of two most spacious indoor courts. B.K. Copenhagen was formed as far back as 1876. From small beginnings, they have certainly grown into a vast organisation. After the match the officials and the team of Birmingham City were entertained to dinner and gone was the competition of the football field, and in its place the joining of new friends in the happiest of atmospheres—certainly one of our chief memories of this enjoyable trip.

K.B. have won 22 Danish championships, the last one in 1953.

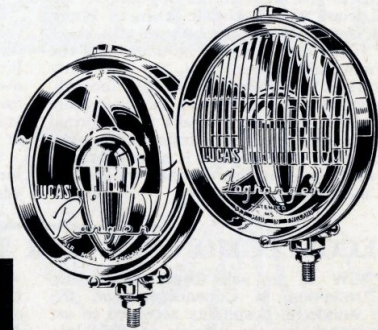

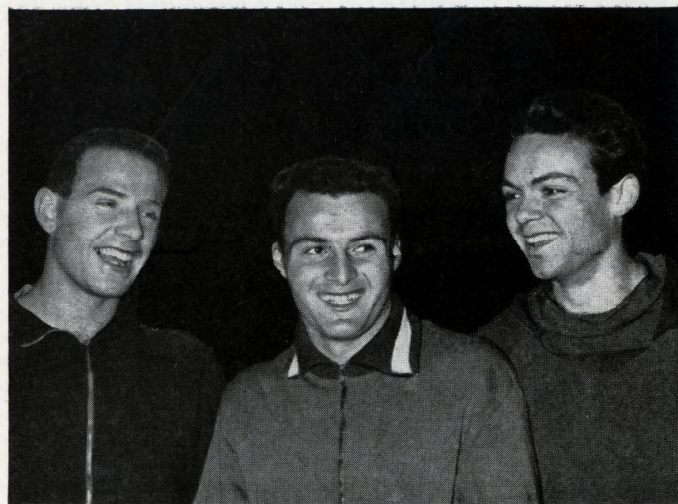

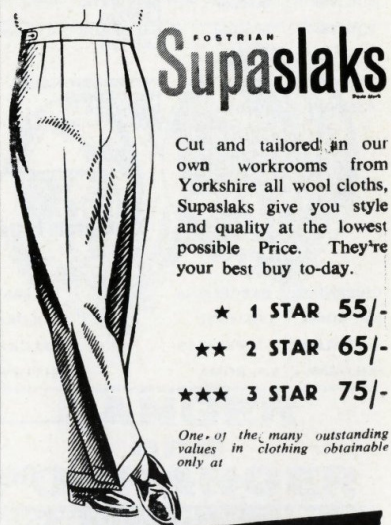

Gil. Merrick's Notes



THE Boldklub of Copenhagen are perhaps the greatest amateur club in existence at the present time, and their tradition is evident as soon as you associate yourself with them.

They have a number of very good players at their disposal, three of them being full internationals who represented Denmark in their gallant effort at the Olympic Games this year. Three of their most promising players were killed in an aeroplane accident whilst the "B" International side was travelling for a match abroad. This was a tragic loss to the Club and, of course, to their actual playing style.

The game a fortnight ago in Copenhagen was spoiled, unfortunately, from a spectacle point of view, for two reasons. Firstly, the lighting system at the stadium was below standard and visibility and judgment were very difficult from the players' angle. Secondly, the atmosphere of the game suffered from the lack of spectators. The Boldklub had permitted the game to be televised for the whole of the Scandinavian countries and the weather was against people leaving the comfort of their fireside. The enthusiasm shown by the few people attending was not evident enough to create a great deal of excitement. However, that did not affect the football played by both sides. After being a goal down early on and then going into a two-goal lead on two occasions at 3-1 and 4-2, it was very disappointing to come away all square.

I feel sure that you will enjoy the type of game played by this very good Danish side, because not only do they play good football but they have the aptitude of being able to fight back when things are going against them. They tackle just as hard as any English club and are exceptionally direct on the wings. Their tall forwards were very dangerous indeed whenever the ball was crossed.

In conclusion, may I hope that we see another fine game of football and may the best team win.

K.B. for short

- 1876 On April 26th the Club was founded for the purpose of playing rounders. The oldest ball-playing club in Denmark.
- 1878 The games of cricket and football were introduced.
- 1880 A youth section was formed (total membership 70).
- 1883 The game of Lawn-Tennis was introduced.
- 1884 The first football match in Denmark was played between the K.B. Club and a Public School called Birkerød.
- 1888 The first football tournament was held under the auspices of the K.B. Club. It was a knock-out tournament with fourteen clubs participating. K.B. won in four rounds with a total score of 40 goals to 0.
- 1889 The Danish Football Association was founded on the initiative of the K.B. Club.
- 1895 By now there was a membership of 300, including the then Prins Christian, later King Christian X, who played Lawn-Tennis.
- 1900 Queen's Park, Glasgow, were the guests of the Club, played two matches and won them both 6-1, and 8-1.
- 1900 The Royal High School Cricket Club were the guests of the Club.
- 1938 The present home of the Club, with the K.B. Hall accommodating 4,000 onlookers at indoor sports, club buildings with facilities for indoor lawn-tennis (two courts), Badminton court, squash court, twenty outdoor lawn-tennis courts, banqueting hall, offices, etc., etc., costing one hundred thousand pounds to erect, was opened in the presence of King Christian X. The then Crown Prince Frederik and Crown Princess Ingrid, now the Danish King and Queen, became members the same year.
- 1943 The K.B. Hall was destroyed by bombs but re-opened in 1945.

Three football pitches and an outdoor swimming pool.

In 1895 the Club had 300 members; in 1910 1,950 members; in 1920 3,100 members; in 1950 4,350 members, culminating in 1954 with over 5,000 members.
