A BRIEF HISTORY OF R.C.D. ESPANOL

THE R.C.D. Espanol Club was founded In the year 1900, but at the outset they were named "Sociedad Española de Futbol", and played their first match on November 11th of that year. In this first year of their formation they had to seek fixtures to make up their programme, and recall that their second ever game was against a team of Scots, then resident in Barcelona. Español joined the Spanish Football League in 1901 and in season 1902/3 enjoyed their first success when they won the Catalan League Cup. Their first game against foreign opposition was in December 1904 when they played a Toulouse side whom they beat 7-2. It is interesting to note than in 1911/12 the then King of Spain, Alfonso XIII, accepted the Presidency of the Club, and the new name Real Espanol was adopted.

In season 1915/16 Ricardo Zamora, at the age of fifteen, made his debut in goal. Zamora, you will remember, was to become the greatest goalkeeper of all time in the history of Spanish football.

Español moved to their present ground in 1923, when the capacity was only 15,000, but since then a great deal of improvement has taken place and the present limit is 40,000. They won the Spanish Cup in 1929, beating Real Madrid 2-1 at Valencia. In 1940 they were again Cup winners, beating Real Madrid once more by 3 goals to 2.

Español have the distinction, along with Real Madrid, Barcelona and Bilbao, of being in the First Division throughout their career. This is the first time that the Club has participated in the Inter-Cities Fairs Cup, and progressed from the preliminary round when they eliminated Hanover F.C. on a 3-0 aggregate.


In the Español team there are a number of players who have represented their country in international spheres. The most notable being their right-back and captain Argiles, Bartoli centre-half, Sastre left-half and outside-left Camps. The latter notched three goals against us during the first leg in Barcelona.






