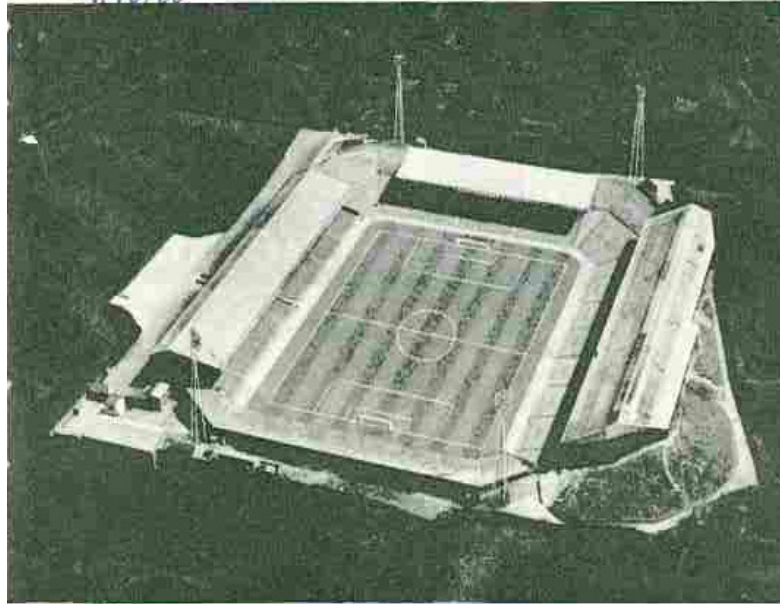

Statistics—Inter-Cities' Fair Cup Competition

OF the seven cup ties played under the St. Andrew's floodlights since December 1956, Birmingham City have won six and drawn one. In the return matches, which involved visits to Yugoslavia, Italy, Spain, Germany and Belgium, eight games have been played, two have been won, three drawn, and three lost (all three defeats at the hands of the great Barcelona side).

This will be the third Competition that has been organised from the Headquarters in Basle, Switzerland. In the first Competition, covering the 1956 to 1958 period, the twelve competing teams were divided into four groups of three. The leading team in each group passed into the Semi-Final and had to reach the Final in the usual knock-out fashion. All matches were played on a home and away system. Birmingham City led their group and were

only denied a place in the Final by virtue of a 2-1 defeat in the replayed Semi-Final in Basle, against Barcelona.

In the 1958 to 1960 Competition the sixteen teams were divided into two groups of eight, with the knock-out rule applying on a home and away basis. Birmingham City reached the Final of this Competition but were eventually beaten in Barcelona after a hard-fought draw at St. Andrew's.

The present Tournament has been "streamlined" to cover the 1960/61 season, with the same set-up of groups as the last Competition. In Group "B" along with Birmingham City are: Basle (Switzerland), Belgrade (Yugoslavia), Leipzig (East Germany), Copenhagen (Denmark), Hanover (West Germany), Inter-Milan (Italy), and Ujpesti Dozsa (Hungary).

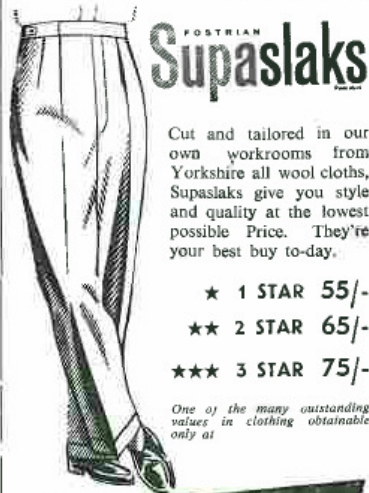

History and Background of Ujpesti Dozsa

THE Ujpesti Dozsa Club has risen to great prominence in Hungary in recent years, and particularly since 1955 onwards. They are now regarded as possibly the best team in that country, and prior to a recent cessation of football due to Olympic representation they were the current leaders of the Hungarian Senior Division. At present they are also participating in the European Cup Competition, and we would like to congratulate them on their success against Belgrade in the First Round. They emerged as victors with a goals aggregate of 5-2. It is also interesting to note that recently they played in Milan and won 4-2.

A number of their players will have been observed on television recently by those who saw the International game Hungary v. Yugoslavia, and no doubt the brilliant goal scored by Janos Göröcs will have been noted. In the same match excellent

displays were also given by Torok in goal, and Rajna at right-back.

Apart from this array of talent, the team appearing at St. Andrew's tonight includes many more most experienced players and, although it is difficult to select, perhaps Toth at outside-left, Szusza at centre-forward, and Várhidi at centre-half should take the eye.

Previously, prior to this present season, the Budapest team was trained and coached by Hungarian Coach Gustav Sebes. Sebes has moved on to the Honved side and Ujpesti are now capably handled by László Fenyvesi, also a most experienced person in this work. They have done a great job of team building, and will undoubtedly be most difficult opponents for any side to vanquish. Their football is of the studied, intelligent type of play, but let no one doubt that they use speed and interchange as necessary.

Who's Who at Ujpesti Dozsa

- Gábor Török:** GOALKEEPER. Age 24. Has made eight appearances in the Hungarian Senior International Team and five appearances for the "B" Team; also a member of the Hungarian Olympic side.
- Károly Rajna:** RIGHT-BACK. Age 26. Has two appearances in the Senior International side, and eight appearances in the "B" Team to his credit.
- József Gyórvári:** LEFT-BACK. Age 26. On the brink of Senior representation with five appearances in the "B" Team.
- József Szini:** RIGHT-HALF. Age 25. Another player knocking on the door of the Senior International Team with seven "B" Team appearances.
- Pál Várhidi:** CENTRE-HALF. Age 28. A defender of great experience with eleven Senior International appearances, six "B" Team appearances, and has also appeared in the Hungarian Olympic Team.
- György Borsányi:** LEFT-HALF. Age 26. Has played for the Senior International side and, additionally, has eight appearances in the "B" Team.
- József Bencsics:** OUTSIDE-RIGHT. Age 26. A very speedy winger who has seven Senior International and four "B" Team appearances to his credit.
- János Göröcs:** INSIDE-RIGHT. Age 21. A player of great talent who at an early age has already eighteen Senior Caps.
- Ferenc Szusza:** CENTRE-FORWARD. Age 36. The most experienced member of the team and a great favourite throughout Hungary. Has made thirty-nine Senior International appearances and has played on twenty occasions for the "B" Team.
- Béla Kuharszky:** INSIDE-LEFT. Age 20. Fast maturing and, since playing in Youth Internationals, has made five "B" Team appearances.
- Mihály Tóth:** OUTSIDE-LEFT. Age 34. Another most experienced player and well known, with fourteen Senior International appearances and seventeen "B" Team appearances behind him. Also played for Hungary in the World Cup Competition.

RESERVES

- Ferenc Lung:** GOALKEEPER. Age 28. Held in reserve for the International teams on many occasions and playing twice for the "B" Team.
- Károly Nagy:** OUTSIDE-RIGHT. Age 25. Another International Reserve player, only kept out by the brilliance of his First Team counterpart.
- László Pataki:** CENTRE-FORWARD. Age 20. A Youth International on five occasions and regarded as a most talented young player.
- István Helápi:** INSIDE-LEFT. Age 21. Yet another young and promising reserve who was a Youth International on several occasions.
